





# Spese militari in Nord Africa e Medio Oriente 2001-2014 (md \$)




# Medio Oriente: importazioni militari 2004-2014







## Italia: export militare in M.O. e Nord Africa 2010-2014













# Il crescente costo umano della guerra: Persone costrette alla fuga quotidianamente dal 2010










## Top destination countries

Border crossings by sea, number of illegal detections, 2014, '000




